17/19 **APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE:** Cllr. M Hugill (prior commitment).

18/19 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:** None.

19/19 **MINUTES**

Having been previously circulated, the minutes of the meeting of 10th May 2019 were **approved** as an accurate record & signed by the Chairman.

PROCEDURAL ITEM – *No suspension of Standing Orders as no public present.*

20/19 **PUBLIC OPEN FORUM** None present.

21/19 **MATTERS RAISED IN THE PUBLIC OPEN FORUM** None.

22/19 **REPORTS**

- a) **Police:** Written report **received**. A councillor commented on the number of large/agricultural vehicles he saw where the driver was using a mobile phone while driving.
- b) **County:** No report to receive.
- c) **Borough:** Borough Cllr. Phillips reported SBC had just agreed to buy the building in Newborough which used to house Argos - it was intended to demolish and in its place erect shops with 150+ flats above to provide accommodation for NHS staff and students at Coventry University.
- d) **Clerk:** No matters to report.

23/19 **2019 PARISH ASSEMBLY** Draft minutes had been circulated with the agenda and councillors confirmed they were an accurate record.

24/19 **NATIONAL PARK PARISH MEMBER ELECTIONS** [*Minute 15/19b*] refers]- **Noted** Clerk had circulated details of nominees to all councillors, collated the votes of each councillor & following the Chairman's casting vote, submitted B. Marley to NYMNP as this Council's vote. With the Chairman's permission Mr Marley spoke to the meeting, confirming he had been elected and giving a very short résumé of his role.

25/19 **COMMUNITY DEFIBRILLATOR** Cllr. Lockey had asked for this item to be on the agenda. He explained that it was felt there should be a defib in Hackness. The Village Hall Committee had also discussed the matter and were prepared to have one sited externally at the village hall. The Parish Council agreed in principle to the provision of a community defib at the village hall. It was **agreed** it was more appropriate for the Village Hall Committee to make further enquiries as to costs and what was needed then report to a future Parish Council meeting.

Cllr. McGregor arrived during the next item.

26/19 **COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS**

On behalf of a parishioner Cllr. Dickinson reported 1] the public bridleway in both directions from Whisperdales had been bulldozed wider as had the public footpath through the bluebell wood in Fewler Gate Wood (**agreed** Clerk to inform NYMNP/NYCC); 2] a metal feed bin on a concrete base beside the road in Broxa (**agreed** Clerk to refer to Highways/NYCC). Cllr. Chapman reported white lines had still not been painted on the bends near Suffield Farm (Clerk to refer to Highways). Cllr. Foxton reported the overhanging trees on Stepney Hill were to be cut in the near future. Cllr. McGregor reported potholes at the road edges on the stretch between Gowland Lane and the top of Lindhead Bank (Clerk to refer to Highways). Cllr. Lockey asked about verges - Hackness lakeside had not been done and Forge

Valley needed doing. It was **agreed** that Mr Flinton would be asked to carry out a second cut between now and the end of August (the feeling being that Council would probably then go back to one cut a year for the next couple of years to keep expenditure down). Borough Cllr. Phillips is to ask SBC if they can cut Forge Valley. Cllr. Lockey reported he had also received a reply (dated 30/5/19) from the Chairman of Scalby Library in response to the letter he'd sent after the May Council meeting in which he had confirmed there had not been a mistake in the amount of donation the Council had made to library funds [*Minute 15/19a refers*].

August 2019

Two RTCs in your area during August. One in Suffield during the night where a vehicle struck a roadside cart selling produce causing extensive damage. This is currently under investigation.

The second RTC occurred near to the Falcon Pub and involved one vehicle. The driver was arrested on suspicion of drink driving, this is also still under investigation.

Two violence crimes were reported in the area during August. Both related to domestic incidents.

One report of Fraud this month where the HMRC scam was attempted over the phone on a gentleman on High Street in Scalby. The fraudsters became irritated with the gentleman for not falling for the scam and the call was ended.

A dwelling burglary was reported in Scalby during August. A male was arrested and charged in connection with this and is appearing at York Crown Court later in September.

The Corner House Tea Rooms on Scalby Road was broken into overnight on 20th August to 21st. Two people have been arrested in connection with this and the offence is still under investigation.

A theft from a vehicle was reported to Police on 1st August but occurred on 4th July. Two leaf blowers belonging to Beyond Housing were stolen from the back of a pickup whilst the grounds maintenance team were working on Chichester Close in Scalby.

On 25th August on Scalby Road in near to the Scalby/Newby boundary, Police received three separate reports of youths fighting in the street. Officers attended and spoke to people involved. It was a youngsters party which had spilled out of the house and a disturbance then occurred in the street between attendees.

There were four 'ASB Personal' incidents this month, all of which were disputes between people known to each other. One ASB nuisance incident was reported, this related to loud music being played in a flat.

Officers attended Kirk Gate in Hackness on 9th August after a commercial carrying a load of pallets became stuck on the top of a hill and blocking the road. Officers attended and assisted the driver.

Please note that in addition to the traditional 999 or 101 we can be contacted on our email address is snafiley@northyorkshire.pnn.police.uk. Please do not report incidents to this email, but if you would like to speak to a member of our team for advice then please use it.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal

with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

PC Bilton has this year carried out various wildlife talks in his role as rural Officer and Wildlife Crime Officer. If any parish councils would like any information about wildlife crime then please contact your rural team.
